tion phone mob we're going to do together, the inperson video prank for me, and more security cam pranks. And, of



The Anti-Digit Dialing League

Out in the West, where digit dialing (replacing telephone exchange names with numbers) has made more inroads than anywhere else, there has been considerable opposition to the telephone company's plans. In fact, the Anti-Digit Dialing League (571 Seventh Street, San Francisco) has several thousand members and is busy preparing a court case against the phone company.

The ADDL's case is that numbers are harder to remember than letters and also more inhuman. Their booklet reports that nine out of ten voters (in a poll conducted by the SF Chronicle) supported their views, but that the phone company refuses to listen to reason on the grounds that changing from letters to numbers allows the use of more needed combinations. (The ADDL says this a lie and produces figures to back up their charge in a booklet called "Phones Are for People.")

But it's the same old story: despite protests, the phone company will neither listen to reason nor discuss the situation. And so far, 17 million of the nation's 77-million phones have lost their letters in favor of numbers. The time to reverse the trend is NOW.

What I suggest is that all of you-anywhere in the U. S.-who object to this arrogant attitude of the phone company pick up the telephone at any and every opportunity, dial "O" (it won't cost you anything), and say to the operator: "I'm calling to register my vote against digit dialing." You might even have rubber stamps or stickers made saying: "Call 'O' to Vote Against Digit Dialing."

If the phone company gets enough calls, I think they might be ready to discuss the matter with ADDL's lawyers. At the moment they refuse to debate the issue.
